ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The goal of the Rope Access program is to help Aboriginal individuals explore and acquire the essential employability skills required for work in the roping sector.

Learning is in an interactive and supportive classroom environment that consists of a combination of: one to one teaching, selfdirected and experiential learning in a group environment.

PARTICIPANTS WILL:

- Receive a targeted Essential Skills coaching regime
- Participate in vocational and learning assessments
- Develop industry specific cover letters, resumes and interview techniques and job search skills
- Engage in industry interviews with employer partners

WHAT IS ROPE ACCESS?

Rope Access is a two rope system derived from caving and mountaineering. In the early 1990's in the United Kingdom this system was adapted for use the industrial market.

Rope access now serves a global community of tradespeople and individuals who are able to reach very unconventional spaces to complete a wide scope of work in spaces typically considered inaccessible.

Rope Access combines: access, labor and rescue in a single team making it one of the safest ways to complete work at height.

JOB REQUIREMENTS

In this industry staff members are required to be:

- Requires a healthy respect for safety at height and a commitment to best practice and safety above all else
- Must have <u>No fear of heights</u>
- Punctual, reliable and hard working
- In good physical condition
- Supportive team player
- Ability to work in unconventional spaces
 and places

- At imminent risk of homelessness
- Available to attend full time
- Have a referral from an ACCESS
 Employment Counsellor
